

We would like to say a huge THANK YOU to the MANY friends and supporters who dined at Bob Evans and contributed to our 2016 #GivingTuesday campaign. Before we received the totals on the Bob Evans contributions, in just one day, you generated \$13,188 in direct donations to help purchase a wheelchair accessible vehicle.

A total of 307 flyers were collected at local Bob Evans Restaurants bringing in a donation of \$1,101 to our ministry. By our estimates, that means more than 700 friends of Luther Home stopped by to grab a delicious meal to help us raise funds on #GivingTuesday. We are blown away by your support and so thankful to Bob Evans for allowing us this opportunity!

We would also like to thank our friends at TESCO Bus for their generous donation of \$1,000 to our <u>#GivingTuesday</u> campaign. TESCO, a longtime friend and supporter of LHM, is a local company and one of the nation's largest bus distributors.

Thanks to a generous Domestic Grant from the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Luther Home of Mercy has been working on establishing a Host Home Program. The Host Home Program is designed to match individuals or families who are willing to open their homes and hearts and welcome a person with developmental disabilities into their lives. Unlike our more traditional settings, such as a group home or intermediate care facility, the Host Home Program offers individuals the benefits and enjoyment of living in a family environment while also receiving

the supports necessary for a full and independent life in the community. LHM will carefully screen and select Host Home providers and, with the help of county personnel, match them with interested individuals based on common interests and compatibility. We will also offer on-going support and supervision for both the individual and the family as they journey together. Client Spotlight: Meet Melissa

Melissa joined our ministry as a client at our newest day habilitation site, Advent Lutheran Center, when it opened its doors this past May. Melissa toured Advent and knew it was a good fit for her. Other than being a short distance from her home in Sylvania, which she shares with her parents, Advent provides her with social opportunities as Melissa describes, "I get to meet others and get involved in the community". At day program, she enjoys working on the computer, being a social butterfly by interacting and joking with the staff & clients, crafting projects and baking.



At home, Melissa enjoys hanging out with her cat, Porky, and watching scary movies. Along with her parents, she has three siblings, three nephews and three nieces. She loves spending time with her family, especially her nieces and nephews, and taking family trips. Their most recent trip was to Great Wolf Lodge in Sandusky. She also spends time helping her mother babysit her nieces and nephews. Beyond babysitting, she is happy to share experiences and teach them about diversity. "I like being able to help them recognize others and accept others."

In many ways, Melissa is a social butterfly. About three years ago, her and her mother created a ladies group that has grown into about twenty women that meet once a month at a local restaurant to socialize. She is also involved in LHM's On the Move's bowling team. Melissa once volunteered at St. Vincent Hospital women's clinic as a greeter and assisted in their clothing donation room. "I loved volunteering; I got to meet women while they were pregnant and then see the babies after they were born." She described her experience as very rewarding and hopes that she can get involved with volunteering again in the future.
