

## Remembering Pastor Don

#### Pastor Donald L. Wukotich, Executive Director Emeritus

August 30, 1942 - April 14, 2025

Pastor Don, Executive Director Emeritus of Lutheran Ministries of Mercy, passed away just several weeks ago, leaving behind a legacy that will resonate for many years to come. His career in ministry was marked by a steadfast commitment to service, shepherding communities with compassion, wisdom and unwavering faith.



In his early career, Don served in various churches, in hospital and jail settings and in social service organizations. He came to Luther Home of Mercy in 1986, as Executive Director, and was the catalyst in forming Lutheran Ministries of Mercy, which he led until his retirement in 2017. Upon retirement, Pastor Don continued to serve as President of the Luther Home of Mercy Foundation.

During his time leading our agencies, Pastor Don brought a deep sense of mission to every decision, always guided by humility and integrity. His quiet wisdom and servant leadership inspired all who worked beside



him. Under his guidance, the organization grew both in reach and in heart, never losing sight of its core purpose - to uplift and support those in need. Pastor Don led by example, reminding us daily that our work is a calling and that every person served, and every person employed, matter deeply.

As a gifted speaker and writer, Pastor Don had a unique way of reaching hearts... he spoke with compassion, conviction and humor, turning ordinary moments into meaningful reflections. His voice was always one of encouragement and his presence was an anchor in times of uncertainty and a light in moments of challenge.

As we say farewell to our dear friend, he remains ever-present in the mission he helped shape. His words continue to guide our path and his values live on in the work we do each day. We mourn his loss deeply, but also celebrate a life lived with purpose, grace and unwavering devotion.

### Donald L. Wukotich Scholarship

The Donald L. Wukotich Scholarship was created by the Lutheran Ministries of Mercy Board of Directors in 2017 to commemorate Pastor Don's 31 years of service to our ministries upon his retirement.

Semi-annually, part-time and full-time staff (Luther Home of Mercy, Filling Homes and Lutheran Social Services), pursuing higher education in fields related to our ministries, may apply. Since it was established, 46 scholarships have been awarded, totaling over \$21,000.
