There's nothing more beautiful than the love parents have for their children. When these tiny little people are born, moms and dads pour all of their hopes and dreams into loving, caring and nurturing.

What I have learned from the parents and families, of those we serve at Luther Home, is that having a child with an intellectual and developmental disability doesn't change that at all; in fact, that parent-child bond is often even stronger.

Some of the most remarkable people I have ever met are the family members of those entrusted to us. It is not uncommon to meet loved ones who share stories of sleepless nights lasting decades rather than those first few months of infancy; or battles with doctors who didn't think their child had a chance at a full life. And that's not to mention the many challenges that can come when seeking the best possible education.

The physical strain of providing decades of round-the-clock care combined with the fear of an uncertain future is something that only a loved one of a person with a disability can truly understand. Yet through adversity and

heartache, a love and fierce devotion blooms and grows into something uniquely beautiful.

If you ever get a chance to meet with parents of those we serve, they will likely tell you that two of the hardest days of their lives were the day they found out their child had a disability and the day their child moved out of their family home.

It means so much to us that on one of their hardest days, they chose Luther Home to be by their side. It is such an honor to hear Craig's Dad share that he and his wife Phyllis looked all over 10 states to find the best possible care and being here "feels just like home."

Michael's Mom recently shared that she put him on our waitlist decades ago so we would be ready when the time was right.

We know, that those entrusted to us, are someone else's most precious person. We also know that the care we provide will never be quite like mom and dad. Our daily hope and promise is to always do our best to be the next best thing.

Shared Living: Support That Feels Like Home

Shared Living is a meaningful option for adults with developmental disabilities who are receiving services through an IO Waiver. It allows a person to live in a family-like setting—often with a relative or dedicated caregiver—while receiving the personalized support they need to live safely, comfortably and with dignity.

In Shared Living, the individual lives with one

or more family members or a caregiver who provides at least 20% of their daily care and support. This model focuses on building strong relationships, honoring personal choice and creating a stable home environment where people can truly thrive.

Why Choose Shared Living?

Shared Living offers many benefits that go beyond traditional service models:

- Strengthens family bonds and long-term relationships while encouraging meaningful community connections
- Provides consistency of care in a safe, supportive home environment
- Encourages genuine community life, not just access to services
- Supports daily routines chosen by the individual, promoting independence and comfort
- Promotes shared decision-making, ensuring the person's voice is central to their care



Personalized Support Services

Services are tailored to each person's needs and may include:

- Assistance with daily living tasks such as bathing, grooming, cooking and cleaning
- Transportation to medical appointments, work and community activities
- Support with planning social opportunities and healthcare visits
- Medication administration and health monitoring
- Documentation of services provided and reporting of unusual incidents

Ongoing Support for Caregivers

Shared Living caregivers are not alone. Comprehensive, 24/7 support is provided to ensure success for both the individual and the caregiver, including:

- Billing for services and documentation support
- Safety adaptations for the home
- All required trainings provided at no cost, with most available online
- Ongoing communication with DODD and the county board
- Assistance with compliance, ISP planning, incident reporting and well-being checks

Shared Living is more than a service—it's a partnership built on trust, stability and community. For many individuals and families, it provides the foundation for a fulfilling life at home and beyond.

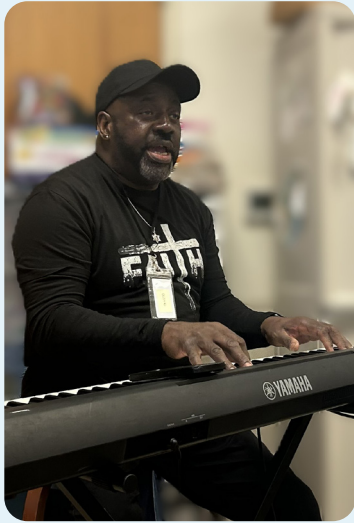
